# NON-U.S. TRADE CONTROLS: A DEEPER DIVE

You have asked for it and we have brought it back. In response to an overwhelming demand for another look at non-U.S. trade controls, the North Texas District Export Council will offer a reprise by taking you on a deeper dive into the labyrinth of trade compliance on an international scale. Instead of you having to jet around the planet in these uncertain economic times in order to update your trade compliance knowledge, we are bringing the world to you by holding in one location a conference that will feature experts from several regions discussing how trade controls in a variety of countries can affect your operations. From Europe to Latin America to the Far East, this conference will span the globe in an effort to mine for you the most up to date information on how your company can stay up to speed in trade controls compliance.

While most U.S. exporters have at least a minimal familiarity with and awareness of the basics of U.S. trade controls and compliance requirements, the trade controls of other countries in which they may operate or do business with are frequently overlooked. - What are the differing trade controls regimes?

In addition to various sessions and regional panels, there will also be an opportunity for participants to have one-on-one consultations with conference presenters. Trade compliance is not an option in the U.S. or in other countries. It is incumbent for U.S. firms to understand the trade compliance requirements of all the countries in which they do business with or operate.
